It could be a birthday or another special celebration. Draw a picture to show what happened and write a sentence about it.</p>	<p>Ask someone in your family what you were like as a baby and look at your baby photographs. Make a list of things that can you do now that you couldn't do then.</p>	<p>Use magazines, books and family photographs to find out how humans change as they grow. Look for people at different stages of life, including baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult and elderly. Draw a picture and write a sentence about each stage of human life.</p>
<p>Speak to older members of your family to find out how their childhoods were similar to or different from yours. Ask them about a range of topics, such as toys, food, home and school. Draw pictures or write some sentences to record what they say.</p>	<p>Write a list of the people in your family. How many people are there? Can you remember all their names? How are they related to you?</p>	<p>Find a selection of materials in your house. Can you think of an adjective to describe each material?</p>	<p>Make an information poster about your family. Share your poster with someone in your family for feedback.</p>
